## Sympathy for Samael ✧ What it is

Sympathy for Samael is a hypertext temple of what some would call heresy, but I view it as a light along the path to questions that deserve answers. There are wounds in “the word”, and though religion can lead to peace the cost it carries is steep. There is a famous quote from Star Wars, where Yoda tells Luke that he must unlearn what he has learned.

This is not about killing faith, but helping to guide it towards a worthier direction. Through the use of my prose, collection of resources, and interactive tools I invite you to explore your own questions.

Let’s explore frameworks I lean on.

## Frameworks ✧ You worship the D&VIL or You Are Evil

I do not believe in a literal red-horned fire and brimstone aroma heavy demon daddy. I respect the Archetype he represents; the pursuit of knowledge, equality, and self-empowerment. To me the Christian Mythology depiction of Samael (The Venom of God) is the one who challenges unchecked power in the hands of an undeserving deity. Power will inherently deserve critique. By being Sympathetic to the “Devil” myself growing up, I was able to think differently about the religion being lathered over me.

As for the comment on me being evil, bold of you to assume we even agree on what evil is. You believe what the Bible says about evil. I believe evil is mass-murder, subjugation of people’s free-will & agency, and teaching people that they are born broken. I grew up asking questions about the scripture and when I did so it wasn’t embracing evil. I refused to accept cruelty as holy. It was not rebellion against goodness, but loyalty to what that word means.

## Frameworks ✧ When they quote scripture at you

That book may hold authority for you, but I am not bound by it. I treat scripture as history, and literature, not as law. Are you aware of how many times that book has been translated? King James Version specifically rewritten to enforce rule and loyalty to the crown/ruling class. Continuing to quote at me is like reading the rules of chess to someone who isn’t even playing the game.

## Frameworks ✧ You’re going to burn in hell



If belief is only sustainable through threats of eternal damnation, infinite punishment for finite crimes, is it belief or coercion? Since I don't believe in hell, I can speak in absence of fear and ask the questions others were told is doubt.

*Frameworks ✧ You were never saved in the first place*

You're claiming my faith wasn't for real, and thus my apostasy doesn't count. I'm claiming this is my lived experience. My leaving doesn't erase my past, yet proves that faith can be sincere and still unravel. Salvation being real yet fragile enough to disappear when questioned what would that say about your god's promises?

*Frameworks ✧ You're just angry and bitter*

I'm tired and angry, but somebody should be (Halsey.) Tired and angry of the abuse of children, hypocrisy, acceptance of a death-cult controlling so much of the world in which we live. My anger is not all consuming. It was formed by reason and evidence, not just emotion. My anger is proof that I cared. Prophets were also angry at injustice – was theirs unjustified too?
